NATIONAL FREIGHT AND SUPPLY CHAIN STRATEGY IMPLEMENTATION ARRANGEMENTS

Western Australia

In August 2019, the Transport and Infrastructure Council (TIC) endorsed the *National Freight* and *Supply Chain Strategy* and *National Action Plan*, as the Australia-wide strategy to manage freight growth and change.

Following the public release of the Strategy and National Action Plan, the Western Australian Departments of Transport and Planning, Lands and Heritage hosted a workshop to gain an understanding of stakeholder views to inform the development of a plan for State based implementation of the National Freight and Supply Chain Strategy and National Action Plan.

Forty stakeholders representing a broad range of the WA transport, logistics and planning industries and relevant State Government agencies and Local Government Authorities participated in the workshop.

Stakeholders expressed support for and interest in continued involvement in the Western Australian response to the National Freight and Supply Chain Strategy.

Stakeholders identified priority actions for further consideration, including:

- Improve heavy vehicle accreditation, access, permits and running at port.
- Develop regional supply chain strategies.
- Industry to participate in open data portal hubs and data sharing.
- Enhance the social license of freight and encourage community acceptance.

A Stakeholder group is being established to provide ongoing input with respect to informing the development of the WA implementation plan and assist with annual reporting on progress to TIC.

Each jurisdiction will play a critical role in implementing the Strategy and agreed National Actions. In Western Australia, local implementation arrangements will involve coordinated actions with Commonwealth, State and Local governments, transport, planning and roads authorities, business across the local transport and logistics industry, research sectors and the community.

Specific initiatives from the *National Action Plan* for implementation in WA are provided in <u>Appendix 1</u> – National Action Plan WA Implementation Arrangements. Further WA Implementation arrangements will be developed in consultation with relevant stakeholders.
